She was awarded the MARA Excellent Student Scheme scholarship to study medicine in the University in Nottingham and graduated in 2012 with Bachelor of Medical Science (BMedSci) and Bachelor of Medicine, Bachelor of Surgery (BMBS) degree.

She achieved her MRCP diploma in 2015, and PgCert in Oncology with distinction in 2017. In 2020, she achieved a Fellowship of Royal College of Radiologists (FRCR), and completed Clinical Oncology training in 2022. During her Clinical Oncology training, she also completed an Out of Programme fellowship in stereotactic radiosurgery (SRS) and ablative radiotherapy (SABR) in Guys and St Thomas'.

Puteri has recently collaborated in a project to develop a consensus in management of recurrent head and neck cancer as part of The International Centre of Recurrent Head and Neck Cancer (IREC) network and is a co-investigator for the DETERMINE study, which gives her the opportunity to offer patients with rare salivary gland cancers with identifiable genetic alteration access to targeted treatment. She has participated in a number of clinical and translational research projects, and presented in national and international conferences.

Puteri is passionate about providing the best care for patients and improving patient's outcomes through improvement in radiotherapy techniques and research.

“Salivary gland cancers are rare, and it is often challenging to manage these cancers due the heterogeneity of the cancers and the lack of clinical trial data to guide therapy.
